The pews came from St. Dominic's Church in Metz, Michigan. St. Dominique's Church was built in 1931 when the original pews were replaced during the remodeling done in 1978. The pews were modified and refinished by Carol Chipman. The wide 30-year-old white pine floor, door and ceiling boards are from the late Joseph Haske of Hawks, Michigan.

Hanging on the wall is the LORD'S PRAYER, a wood cutout plaque, crafted and donated by Fenton Rhine.

As you enter the Chapel, the first thing you notice on the wall is the handsome carving of THE LAST SUPPER, a gift from Leon Jarema. The shingles for the roof were generously donated by Bob Goldsmith. Al Haske put the finishing touch to our little Chapel in the Pines by adding a cross to the top on the outside roof. The beautiful stained-glass windows were designed and especially crafted by Sandy Eaton for the Flywheeler's Chapel.
